I. Call to Order Invocation Pledge of Allegiance

1. Consider, discuss and take possible action to approve Resolution R23-001 to hold a public hearing at the February 14, 2023, City Council Meeting regarding a proposed Annexation.

He also has worked with the neighborhood around Abney Park and formulated those ideas into the plans.

Consider, discuss and take possible action to approve Ordinance 23-006 an Ordinance of the City of Gilmer, Texas adopting the Provisions, Policies and fees for city Water and Sewer Charges and fees for the City Sanitation Services providing for definitions; providing fixed minimum monthly base charge(s), providing rates based on the amount of water consumption during a monthly period; providing for billing and collections; providing rates based on schedule of services; providing for the authorized and prohibiting unauthorized connection, disconnection, initiation, discontinuance or resumption of Water and Sewer Facilities or service within the City of Gilmer, Texas; providing for the authorized and prohibiting the unauthorized solid waste disposal within the City of Gilmer, Texas; providing for miscellaneous fees; providing for a cross-connection control program; providing a savings clause; and providing for repeal of Ordinances in conflict.

City Manager Greg Hutson explained to Council the changes made to the Fee & Rate Ordinance.

Kenneth Harris, Public Works Director explained to the Council the reason for the increase in Water & Sewer Tap Fees.

Councilmember Michael Chevalier made a motion to approve the Order of Election to be held May 6, 2023 with a second by Councilmember Marty Jordan and a vote of 5/0 for approval.
