1. CALL TO ORDER INVOCATION **ROLL CALL** 

> Mayor Tim Marshall called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m. The invocation was led by Councilmember William Hornsby and Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Tim Marshall.

City Manager Greg Hutson reported that sales tax for the month of August was up 17.89% and for the fiscal year we are up 5.14 % from last fiscal year.

Mayor Tim Marshall opened public hearing at 5:18 p.m. City Manager Greg Hutson stated that there will be a 2% pay raise for City Employees, TML insurance was changed from United Healthcare to Blue Cross Blue Shield along with 1.5% premium increase. A new A/C was budgeted for Gilmer Civic Center. The police department salary has been line with other police dpts in the area City Manager encouraged certification for police officers. Fire Chief Jerry Taylor stated that the air packs used by Fire Dpt are 20 years old and are in need of replacement. This is state mandated equipment and must be replaced. City Manager Greg Hutson also pointed out revenue summary for the budget year is at 3,524,835.00 and the expenditure summary shows 3,529,725.00. Mayor Tim Marshall closed public hearing at 5:25 p.m.
