Mayor Tim Marshall called the meeting to order at 5:16 P.M. The invocation was led by City Manager Greg Hutson, and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Pro-Tem Pete Herrmann.

Mayor Pro-Tem Pete Herrmann made a motion to approve all consent agenda items, with a second by Councilmember Jerry Webb and a vote of 6/0 for approval.

V. Items to Consider

1. Conduct a public hearing regarding Voter Approval Rate of \$0.503142 per one hundred (\$100) valuation for the City of Gilmer, Texas, for the one-year period beginning October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026 (Enclosed).

Councilmember Jarom Tefteller made a motion to enter the public hearing, with a second by Councilmember Jasmine McDowell and a vote of 6/0 for approval.

Mayor Tim Marshall discussed the proposed tax rate of \$.503142 per one hundred (\$100) valuation and that it is a lower amount than previously proposed. If the new lower amount is approved by the city council, there would not be an option for the public to file a petition for an election.

Mayor Pro-Tem Pete Herrmann made a motion to exit the public hearing, with a second by Councilmember Jarom Tefteller and a vote of 6/0 for approval.

2. Consider, discuss, and take possible action to approve Ordinance 25-052 setting the Ad Valorem Tax Rate of the City of Gilmer, Texas for the year 2025-2026 at the rate of \$0.503142 per one hundred (\$100) valuation on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Gilmer, Texas, as of January 1, 2025 specifying separate components of such rate for Operations and Maintenance and for Debt Service; Levying Ad Valorem Tax Rate for the year 2025-2026; and ordaining other related matters (Enclosure).

Mayor Tim Marshall made the following motion, "I move that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.503142 per \$100 valuation, which is effectively a 5.52% percent increase in the tax rate. This tax rate is further broken down by \$0.391974 on each \$100 valuation of property for the Maintenance and Operation of general government (general fund), and

\$0.111168 for each \$100 valuation of property for the Interest and Sinking Fund.", with a second by Mayor Pro-Tem Pete Herrmann.
